




The Nativity Riddle Trail: notes

Who? The Nativity Riddle Trail is suitable for all ages. Whoever would like to engage with it is most welcome to follow the trail. It is anticipated that those with families will get the most from the trail. There are several aspects to this trail to make it accessible for as many visitors as possible.

Why? The Nativity Riddle Trail gives the opportunity to experience the story of the first Christmas through storytelling banners and the accompanying Reflection Rings. There is a choice of reading the story from the banners, using the PECS style pictures to tell the story and trying to solve the riddle for each station to find a Christmas themed word.

What? The Nativity Riddle Trail allows visitors to discover the story of the Nativity. Visitors are given a Reflection Ring to complement a banner trail telling the story of the first Christmas. Each banner contains part of the story, and the corresponding page on the Reflection Ring has a simplified version of that part of the story and a riddle to solve. All banners are wheelchair accessible.

How, where and when? Collect a Reflection Ring from the Cathedral Team in the Ticket Office. The trail starts from outside the gift shop and moves around the Nave in a clockwise direction. Please return your Reflection Ring once you have finished the trail. The Nativity Riddle Trail is available at no additional cost to visitors and is available during Cathedral opening hours.
