

# Festal Evensong and Procession for the Feast of St Etheldreda

Queen, Foundress and First Abbess of Ely

with Admission to the Foundation of Emelia King as Chorister

> Sunday 26 June 2022 4pm

Welcome to this Festal Evensong which marks the Feast of St Etheldreda, our Foundress. During this evening's service, we will continue the medieval tradition of regular, even weekly, processions around the Cathedral's precincts with 'stations' for particular sung prayers.

Processions continued after the Reformation and incense was already being used again by the eighteenth century. Tonight we will process to the South Door after the intercessions, and into the Bishop's Garden as we mark the footprint of the monastic cloister, where the first anthem will be sung. The whole procession will then move back into the Cathedral through Prior's Door to the Cross of St Ovin, Steward to St Etheldreda, and finally to the site of St Etheldreda's Shrine.
